ABOUT YOUR COLONOSCOPY

A colonoscopy is an endoscopic procedure used to examine the large intestine. Your doctor may recommend this procedure for:

- Screening for colon cancer
- Changes in your bowel habits
- Blood in your stool
- Unexplained anemia
- Removal of a polyp
- Assessment of diarrhea

PREPARING FOR YOUR COLONOSCOPY

- Your doctor will prescribe a colonoscopy prep during your office appointment or telehealth visit. Please pick up the prep 1-2 weeks ahead of your procedure.
- ***Please refer to the MEDICATION ALERT page at least 1 week prior to your procedure.***
- A colonoscopy prep can cause dehydration. Prepare your body by drinking extra clear liquids *before and during* your prep. Finally, replenish your system by drinking clear liquids *after* returning home.

DAY OF PROCEDURE

- You should plan to arrive 1½ hours before your scheduled colonoscopy time. You will receive a confirmation phone call up to one week before, and again the day before your procedure. The time may change.
- You will need to bring someone with you to take you home. You cannot drive or take public transportation alone for 24 hours after the procedure.
- Please bring your medication list
- Do not bring any valuables or wear any jewelry the day of your procedure.

FINDING PARKING

- **For RWJ:** Park in the parking lot located on Albany Street (by emergency room) and take the elevator to the 2nd floor.
- **For ASP:** Park in the parking lot located on Plum Street and take the elevator to the 4th floor.
- Bring your parking ticket with you. Upon arrival stop at the information desk to check in and have your parking validated.

SUTAB COLONOSCOPY PREPARATION

1 WEEK BEFORE YOUR COLONOSCOPY

- Stop all herbal and vitamin supplements
- Stop all fiber supplements, or anti diarrhea medications
- Avoid salads, raw vegetables, fruits or nuts
- Please refer to the ***MEDICATION ALERT*** on the last page

1 DAY BEFORE YOUR COLONOSCOPY

- Drink **clear liquids only** for breakfast, lunch, and dinner.
- Examples of clear liquids include: **water** (plain, carbonated, or flavored), **fruit juices** without pulp or **flavored beverages, jello, tea or coffee** without milk, clear **fat-free broth**, and plain **ice pops**.
- Drink at least 8 ounces of clear liquid every hour while awake.

Sutab comes in 2 (12 tablet) doses. The tablets may make your abdomen (belly) swell or feel uncomfortable. This is normal. You may also feel nauseous (like you're going to throw up) or distention (a bloated, hard abdomen). If you feel nausea, bloating, or cramping while you're taking the tablets, slow down or stop drinking the water. Only keep drinking the water after these feelings stop.

DOSE 1: Start taking dose 1 around 4 p.m. the day before your colonoscopy.

- 1) Open 1 bottle (12 tablets) of Sutab bowel prep.
- 2) Fill the empty water container with 16 ounces (2 cups) of water, up to the fill line.
- 3) Swallow 1 tablet with a sip of water every 1 to 2 minutes. Drink all 16 ounces of water. Finish all 12 tablets and all 16 ounces of water within 20 minutes.
- 4) One hour after you finish step 3, fill the empty water container again with 16 ounces of water. Drink all 16 ounces of water within 30 minutes.
- 5) Thirty minutes after you finish step 4, fill the empty water container again with 16 ounces of water. Drink all 16 ounces of water within 30 minutes.

DOSE 2: Start taking dose 2 around 10 p.m. the day before your colonoscopy.

- Repeat steps 1-5 above

FINISH DRINKING THE PREPARATION 4 HOURS BEFORE YOUR ARRIVAL

Please complete the entire preparation even if you are passing clear liquid

MEDICATION ALERTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Please note that certain medications require special attention:

- If you are taking any **blood thinning medications**, please contact your doctor for instructions.
 - Rivaroxaban (Xarelto), Dabigatran (Pradaxa), Apixaban (Eliquis), Heparin, Warfarin (Coumadin), Clopidogrel (Plavix), Enoxaparin (Lovenox), Ticagrelor (Brilinta), Aspirin 325mg
- Low dose aspirin (81 mg) can be continued safely.
- Continue all **routine blood pressure or cardiac medications** with a sip of water, as you normally do even on the day of the procedure.
- **Insulin doses should be reduced by 50% the day before and the day of your colonoscopy.**
- All **steroids or medications for seizures** should be taken the morning of the procedure or at least 2 hours before with a small sip of water.
- Tell your doctor if you have allergies.
